

Conflict Minerals Material Purchase Policy

Asia Tech Image Incorporation (ATII) upholds the concept of environmental protection; we are focusing on the supplier education and places particular emphasis on the field of environmental safety and health, wishing to feedback our achievement to society.

On the matter of "Conflict Minerals", ATII has never purchased conflict minerals directly from their origins, meanwhile, we have declared not to use materials such as Tin (Sn), Tantalum (Ta), Tungsten (W), and Gold (Au) originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) as well as other conflict regions.

Furthermore, ATII supports "Conflict-Free Smelter Program". We encourage our suppliers to source from facilities or smelters that have received a "conflict-free" designation by a recognized industry group (such as the EICC), also required suppliers to disclose information on smelters and mines. To deep dive the investigation, ATII has adopted the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI)'s Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (EICC Template) to survey all suppliers' usage status. We will continue to renew our supplier survey to fulfill regulatory and customer requirements.

On the other hand, ATII strictly implement the policy into entire supply chain as described below:

ATII Non-Use of Conflict Minerals Policy:

- 1. ATII products do not contain minerals originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and other conflict regions nor those minerals mined in conditions of armed conflict and human rights abuses.
- 2. ATII requires its suppliers to refuse to use conflict minerals and to disclose the origin of Tin (Sn), Tantalum (Ta), Tungsten (W), and Gold (Au) used. Also fill in the investigation form /sign declaration(Please download Conflict Minerals Reporting Template, and no need to reply again if you have completed the latest survey form before), and provide the Certificate of Origin to ATII.
- 3. ATII requires its suppliers to pass on "ATII Non-Use of Conflict Minerals Policy" to other upstream suppliers and through their supplier chains. The suppliers of ATII shall also require the other upstream suppliers to comply with this policy.

If ATII becomes aware of a supplier who is not in compliance with these expectations, then we will take the appropriate actions to remedy the situation, including reassessment of supplier relationships.
